

Thoughts from our Spiritual Director

What do you want in a church leader? Paul gave Timothy

some strict guidelines in 1Timothy 3:1-7. For example, Paul encourages leaders to be people who are trustworthy, self-controlled, respectable, and gentle. The ultimate goal of the church is to glorify God individually and as a community. Glorifying God requires a working knowledge of and a personal relationship with God.

The purpose of The Walk to Emmaus is to expand participants' spiritual lives, deepen their discipleship, and rekindle their gifts as Christian leaders in their churches and communities. This huge task is carefully, strategically and repeatedly accomplished in the three day experience of Emmaus.

Each week end Walk to Emmaus takes church leaders and potential church leaders on a journey to remind them that Christian leadership is to take its authority from Scripture in all areas of life. The Gospel of Matthew 22:34-40 says we are love God with our heart, soul, mind and strength. Every aspect of our lives is to be subject to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Matthew's criteria should be a key element in identifying church leadership.

Leaders must not only be willing to use their unique gifts; they must be willing and able to "duplicate" themselves in others. One way we all live up to the command to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 23:39) is to regard others as more important than ourselves. When leaders do this they not only pass on Scriptural truth, they teach others how to lead.

Church leaders have to get outside their personal comfort zone. Even the smallest local congregation has to deal with racism, prejudice, money, lack of faithfulness, all of those sins of omission and commission that separate us from God. Church leaders have to be willing and able to speak up in the truth of Scripture.

The Emmaus experience is one of the best training grounds! The experience begins by encouraging each individual to look at their life priority and ends with a plan to maintain the momentum. In between are time so of Spiritual reflection, lessons on study, being the Christian community,

I can witness to God taking men and women who swear they will never speak in public and turning them into excellent speakers and leaders. A significant number of men and women who questioned their ability or interest to participate in church leadership are now serving God in ways they never dreamed – because they gave three days to listen, discuss and learn.

Churches are stronger, leadership is better, and more Christians are serious about the Great Commission and changing their world.

Breathe

Story Behind The Song

A friend's suicide had left her reeling, but out of Marie Barnett's desperate need for God came a worship classic sung around the world.

Marie Barnett didn't consider herself a worship songwriter, although she had led worship with her husband John for years and wrote her own compositions during her personal worship time. John was the writer, penning what Barnett terms "tons" of worship music through the years (including "Holy and Anointed One"). "He's the worship writer," she explains, adding "I never sat down and wrote thinking, This could be sung in a congregation. It was more between me and the Lord in my bedroom with the door locked."

But that all changed during a Sunday evening service at the Mission Viejo Vineyard in Southern California. The Barnetts were leading worship as they had done hundreds of times before, and words to what would become the worship song "Breathe" just spontaneously came out.

"We had been singing 'Isn't He' by John Wimber," Barnett recalls, "and my husband continued to play. I was so enthralled with Jesus at that moment, thinking I could never live, I could never even take a breath if I didn't have a word from Him every day. And so I heard those words-'this is the air I breathe, this is my daily bread'-and I started singing them."

Before she knew it, the congregation had joined her. Still, it wasn't as if Barnett left that night convinced she has a worship hit on her hands. There had been other spontaneous songs, but she soon realized "Breathe" was different. "People would come up to me at the grocery store and say, 'You know what we were singing on Sunday night? I've been singing it all week.'"

So they began to sing the song regularly in church and it continued to elicit a strong response, bringing many to tears. Barnett says even now she can hardly get through it. "I think the word 'desperate' digs deep into me," she says by way of explanation. "The longer I'm a Christian, the more desperate I am for God."

Since writing "Breathe" Barnett regularly contributes songs to the worship time at Vineyard Community Church of Laguna Niguel, the California church where she and her husband lead worship today
