A Pilgrim's Reflections on Denton Area Emmaus Community Walk #1

Friend: 3 days. They give you lots of breaks and you have free time to think about those talks.

Me: I don't think I'm interested.

After this conversation, I was once again approached and asked if I was interested. I was very reluctant. So, I made a condition. If Jerry, another friend of mine, would go, so would I. Great News! Jerry had just signed up! Woe is me. Then, I made another condition. If my wife would write the check and would give me permission to go, then I would do it. A few days later my wife asked me why she had had to write a check for me to go on a walk. By the way, what is this walk I wrote a check for? I don't know. Woe is me again. Ok,

8:00 pm - Candlelight.

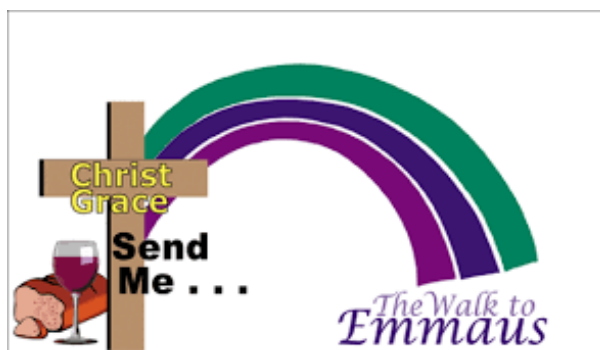
Sunday:

Once the weekend began, I knew I had been had. Thursday night I'm looking for a way out. Silence isn't a bad thing, but how do you get to know those folks if you can't talk? Sleep, no way. We had a guy in our cabin that snored like a freight train. And he slept hard. No sleep Thursday night. Or, for the rest of the weekend for that matter. Friday morning things get rolling. Guess I need to cut out a lot of the detail, cause you guys know what happens. By Sunday, I was really getting into it. Then those letters. I think God had a personal hand in arranging mine. They were all deeply touching and meaningful. I might have cried. Didn't even realize it was almost time to go home. Then closing. I was choked up. I may have even shed a tear or two then as well.

I got home, looked into the agape' bag. More letters! My wife helped me read them. I was floating on air. Looked at the agape. She asked, what's this stuff? I said, it's agape stuff. She didn't understand, but it didn't matter at the time.

When it came time to volunteer for a team, I was right there in line. It has been a great ride. 16 years later and I still look forward to candlelight, closing, team meetings and Reunion group.

Has Emmaus changed my life? Yes. Am I a better person? Yes. And am I still a dunderhead? Yes and if you don't believe me, ask my lovely wife. She can affirm this. But most of all, the Emmaus experience has taught me to be much more accepting, less judgmental and more discerning. Emmaus means the world to me. I have had the privilege of sponsoring several people on their walks. I am grateful to the men and women who made Denton Area Emmaus Community Walk #1 a wonderful experience. And, I am more grateful to God for his Grace than ever before.
