A WORD FROM OUR NEW COMMUNITY LAY DIRECTOR

Welcome to 2013!!

My name is Dave Farish, I took my Walk to Emmaus on Dallas Walk #135, and sat at the Table of Matthew. It is a great honor and privilege to serve you this year as your Community Lay Director. Your Board is already making plans to improve many of the ways we serve you.

In just a matter of days we'll be conducting our first Walk of the year, DAEC (Men's) Walk #57 with DAEC (Women's) Walk #58 to follow in April. With the advent of the New Year, your DAEC Board welcomed four new members who will serve through 2015. They are Genni Burns (Secretary), Tom Clark (Communications/Newsletter), Becky Hughes (Music), and Don Place (Agape/Literature). I encourage you, if you do not know these folks, to introduce yourself and if you feel you can help in any way, to offer yourself either by email or phone message. With the New Year brought some reassessment of our planning for the Walks now that we've had a full year at our new retreat facility Briarwood. Though we are cognizant of keeping weekend costs at a place where they are both affordable and cover our costs, our costs last year considerably outpaced our revenues. As a result we made the difficult decision to raise our **week-end fee to \$175** for both team and pilgrims. This keeps our fee significantly below that of the Dallas Community, but will still require that we offset some of our Community costs through donations and other fundraising opportunities. 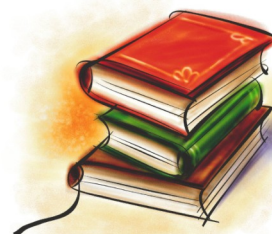
is to make a tax-deductable donation of green agape (cash or check) to the Denton Area Emmaus Community. We also realized that our supply costs, both from the Upper Room and from miscellaneous supplies (paper goods, poster board, markers, spiral notebooks, etc.) have gone up. The team from Walk #57 took it upon themselves to bring an offering of plastic cups to each team meeting as an act of Agape. We plan on offering similar opportunities at Candlelight and at Gatherings for those who feel inclined to give in this way. If you or your reunion group would like to participate in this way, let me or Les Watland (Trailer/Supplies) know and we can connect your passion to our need. (It's a great way to avoid skipping over "Reunion Group Activities" on your Order of Reunion card each week too!)

We are also reassessing the methodology for providing scholarship monies for both team and pilgrim for those for whom the cost of the weekend is a barrier. Monies still exist to provide scholarship relief, however we are encouraging sponsors and team members to see if their reunion group, their church, or other sources can offset at least part of the weekend fee prior to seeking DAEC support. I know that some reunion groups are participating in the walk vicariously by covering the costs either of pilgrims or of their reunion brothers or sisters who are working the walk as a way of participating in the weekend. Sounds pretty "Body of Christ" to me!

Some of you know that back in 2011, your Board began examining ways to reach out to expand the number of churches and people participating in the Walk to Emmaus. If you attend a church where you have pioneered the Emmaus experience and you'd like to be a part of expanding the number of people in your church's Emmaus community, give me a call and together with God's help I believe we can realize that goal. We are already making plans to reach out to several churches where we have limited or no Emmaus presence to see if we can help them equip and encourage greater discipleship in their settings.

Remember, your DEAC Board is here to serve you. If there's anything we can do to improve the Emmaus experience both on the weekend and in your fourth days, let us know; especially if you can be a part of that effort!

My name is Janet Ihne and I am the Spiritual Director for the Denton Area Emmaus Community. I took my walk #11 in 1991 in Slayton, Texas. It was on this walk that I received my call to ministry. I am an ordained Minister of Word and Sacraments in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and I work as a Hospice Chaplain and Bereavement Coordinator. I have been involved in the Denton Area Emmaus Community since 2003 and have served as an Assistant Spiritual Director and Spiritual Director. My role as the Community Spiritual Director began in January, 2013. It is my honor to serve this community, and with Joe Shafer as my predecessor, I know I have big shoes to fill in this role.

Recently, I read through the Examination of Conscience on page 14 of the Worship Booklet for Pilgrims. I have been struggling with what we call "Compassion Fatigue" in the arena of death, dying, and bereavement. The bereavement coordinator I have worked with for five years became one of our patients and recently died. It has been a struggle to be present with the grieving families while I am also grieving for the loss of my friend. Yet God's grace has prevailed. When I think about the means of grace available to me through prayer, Holy Communion, spiritual friends and mentors, I have learned to reach out to

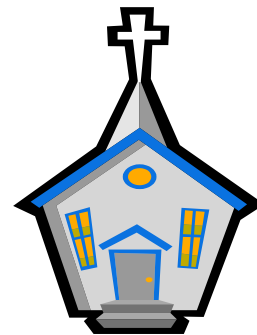

others for support. Yes, in my life, it is easier to give than receive. Yet I have found that having the ability to fall to my knees and admit "I can't do it all," is being a disciple of Christ.

Emmaus lifts us up and provides a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others. As we reflect on our own experiences while we were on our walk, may we never forget or take for granted our mission: to represent Christ to others. SPONSORSHIP—THE MOST IMPORTANT ROLE!

Glory to God for those that have shown that they want to deepen their faith and strengthen their walk with Christ. We know that there are many out there that would like to go on a walk but they don't have a sponsor, have not been asked or invited. All members of the community should be considering sponsorship and searching for good candidates all year round.

WHAT IS SPONSORSHIP?

Good sponsorship is vital to the integrity of Emmaus. Many communities take sponsorship for granted; they assume that everyone knows the how and why of sponsorship. Yet sponsorship is the most important job in Emmaus. It is more than just "signing up people". The quality of sponsorship influences the pilgrim, the health of the Emmaus Movement, and the church affected by the movement.

First, good sponsorship is your first act of agape before a Walk ever begins; the experience of the Walk for a pilgrim really starts with how we handle sponsorship.

Second, good sponsorship undergirds the whole weekend with sacrificial love on behalf of each pilgrim. Sponsors use discernment in recruiting pilgrims, embody the personal commitment of the community to each pilgrim, and provide personal acts of agape during the three days for the pilgrims. These acts of agape include prayer, agape letters, and presence at Send off, Candlelight, Closing, and Follow-up.

Third, good sponsorship is the foundation for a healthy, effective Emmaus movement that is fulfilling its true purpose - the development of Christian leaders and the renewal of the church in ministry. The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of its recruiting practices. If the community is committed to recruiting

strong church leaders for strengthening the local church, then the community will be a strong, vital force in the renewal movement. If, on the other hand, the Walk to Emmaus is viewed as a hospital where every human ill can be cured, it will have a weakening effect on the entire community.

WHY DO WE SPONSOR?

The aim of a sponsor should not be to "get all my friends to go", to fill up the weekend, to fix people's problems, or to reproduce one's own religious experience in others. Rather, the aim of the sponsor is to bring spiritual revitalization to Christians who, in turn, will bring new life and vision to the work of the church in the congregation, home, workplace, and community. The aim of sponsorship is to build up the Body of Christ.
