You can be on a conference room team; work with the outside servant team or the inside servant team; sponsor a pilgrim; attend or host a gathering; or just show up at candlelight and closing.

Sponsorship

So why is this article on sponsorship appearing in the agape corner? Sponsorship is the first act of agape that a pilgrim receives. When does your role as a pilgrim's sponsor end? Some might be inclined to answer "When my pilgrim receives (his or her) cross and is then officially a member of the Emmaus community." Others might think a little beyond that and say, "Sunday evening when I drop my pilgrim off at home."

Not true! Sponsorship is the most important job in Emmaus. The quality of sponsorship influences the pilgrim, the health of the Emmaus movement, and the church being affected by the movement. The aim of sponsorship is to build up the body of Christ.

And sponsorship doesn't just end with the completion of the walk weekend.

The sponsor should be committed to helping the new member in his or her Fourth Day involvement, help find a Reunion Group for the new member, encourage that person to serve the Emmaus community and be active in Emmaus events, and most importantly, help that person sponsor others.

Sponsorship is an act of love for God, for the pilgrim, for the Community and for the church. It is a demonstration of agape love. It is making oneself an instrument of prevenient grace. So find someone to sponsor on our upcoming walks!

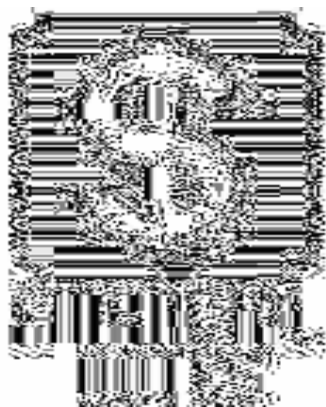


SCHOLARSHIP FUND

If you know someone who has been on a walk who enjoys leading group song sessions, whether he or she can play an instrument or not, then encourage that person to contact the Denton Emmaus community music leader, Jim

Of course, instrumentalists are essential, whether they play keyboards, guitar, mandolin or autoharp. So, if you know someone who can play an instrument (yourself included), encourage that person to contact Jim as well. Or if that person is too shy, then send his or her name to Jim and someone will get back to the musician with an encouraging invitation to join the merry band.

If you've ever wanted to play the guitar, maybe now is the time to dive in and take a few lessons. Playing for an Emmaus event is a great reason to practice.

Our Favorite Emmaus Songs

“I’ll Fly Away”

Albert E. Brumley was born on a cotton farm near Spiro, Oklahoma on October 29, 1905. Before his song writing career, he attended the old Hartford Musical Institute at Hartford, Arkansas and sang with the Hartford Quartet. Later he taught singing schools in various parts of the Ozarks. He met his wife-to-be, Goldie Edith Schell at one of these schools in Powell, Missouri. They were married in 1931 and continued to live at Powell, where they raised their six children.

It was in 1929 that Brumley actually composed "I'll Fly Away". He recalled that he was picking cotton and singing the popular song, "If I Had The Wings Of An Angel". Suddenly, he thought about flying away. Quote, "actually, I was dreaming of flying away from that cotton field when I wrote *I'll Fly Away*". That thought, of course, like the thoughts that underlay all his many songs, was based upon his own deep spiritual convictions.

Mr. Brumley had tried his hand at writing music for a number of years but for the most part this had been just for his own pleasure. Goldie encouraged him to try to have more of his songs published. Albert agreed to try to sell one of his songs and *I'll Fly Away* was mailed to the Hartford Music Company one hot afternoon in July of 1932. Goldie was right and the Hartford Music Company published the song in the book, **The Wonderful Message**. The song began to gain national recognition while numerous others began asking to be allowed to use it in their church books. At the time that the song was accepted and published he was working in his father-in-law's general store for a dollar a day and was then shortly afterward employed by Hartford as a \$12.50 a month staff writer.

The song' "*I'll Fly Away*" became Mr. Brumley's most recorded song.
